Pastor's Message





Dealing with grief, especially during the Lenten season | Encourage Open Dialogue: Foster an atmosphere of with the loss of Ronnie, has made me hear the advice that I often give to others in times of loss. It also reminds me that these steps are easier said than done but here they are:

Acknowledge the Grief: It's important to acknowledge and accept the grief you're feeling. It's a natural response to loss, and it's okay to feel sad, angry, or confused.

Seek Support: Don't try to go through this alone. Reach out to friends, other FLC members and, in my case, fellow pastors who can offer support and understanding. You might also consider seeking pastoral or professional counseling.

Turn to Scripture and Prayer: During Lent, focus on the biblical passages that speak to the themes of suffering, hope, and resurrection. Find solace in prayer and meditation, allowing yourself to be comforted by God's presence.

Lean on Your Faith: Remember the central message of Easter: the promise of resurrection and new life. While grief may feel overwhelming now, hold onto the hope that comes from your faith in Christ. We don't get over our grief—but we will get through it. Our pain is for now, but not forever. Easter is coming and our hope will be restored!

Care for Yourself: In the midst of all the plans and arrangements for others, don't forget to take care of yourself. Make sure you're getting enough rest, eating well, and engaging in activities that bring you joy and relaxation...for me — reading comic books!

openness within our homes and congregation where people feel comfortable sharing their feelings of grief and loss. Pastoral care and support is offered to those who are struggling even when it is the pastor.

Look Ahead with Hope: While grief may feel all-consuming now, remind yourself, as I remind the congregation, that Easter is a time of renewed hope and joy. Trust in the promise of resurrection and the healing power of God's love.

Remember, grieving takes time. It's okay to take things one day at a time. Allow yourself the space to mourn, but also hold onto the hope that comes from your faith in Christ with us.

Ronnie Lee Moretz passed away on February 23 at the Hinkle Hospice House in Lexington surrounded by his wife and children. A celebration of life service was held on February 26 at First Lutheran Church with the Reverend Matthew Lane Miller presiding. Ronnie was a simple man who loved his family deeply and always put others before himself. He was employed as a welder with Martin Marietta Materials for 41 years.

CJ Miller and family upon the passing of her brother. Robert Covington Hall, 75, of King, NC, passed away peacefully on February 7, 2024, at Village Care of King. A memorial service was held on February 11 at Mount Olive Baptist Church. Robert retired from R.J. Reynolds Tobacco Company, where he traveled to 38 countries setting up Quality Assurance Labs. He was a faithful member of Mount Olive Baptist Church, where he served as a trustee, deacon, choir member, Sunday School teacher, and Baptist Men's Director; he also served on the Youth and Senior Adult Councils; he enjoyed many trips with the senior adults, and loved the fall fishing trip to Oak Island. Mr. Hall loved to tinker and could fix anything; he would volunteer to help anyone, and all of his friends and neighbors would bring their mowers to him for repair. He loved sitting on his porch drinking his coffee and would welcome anyone to come up and join him.

Sabrina Conrad and family upon the passing of her cousin. Robert "Larry" Childress, 81, of High Point, passed away January 20 at Kernersville Medical Center. Larry had received a stent just prior to Christmas and never completely recovered; he had numerous health problems. Memorial services were conducted January 27 in the High Point Chapel of Wright Funerals-Cremations. Larry started in retail as a teenager and was manager of Hines Shoes until he retired. He was a former member of the Winston-Salem Jaycees. *Larry never met a stranger and loved all his customers. He had special coffee buddies at Country Bar B Que and Biscuitville in High Point. Larry loved to go to flea markets and yard sales. He will be missed by all who knew him, and his favorite saying was "hang in there". Larry was known as "the candy man" in several area churches.*

OUR THOUGHTS AND PRAYERS:

Bob Redwine had laparoscopic surgery in December 19 for severe diverticulitis and a perforated bowel. In January (while recuperating at a nursing home) he developed an infection at his port site and returned to the hospital. After six weeks of being away from home, he was finally to return to his own home on January 23! He still goes to a treatment center for dialysis, and receives physical and occupational therapy at home. Although he has lost over 20 pounds, he is trying to get his strength back with the wonderful assistance of his "at-home-nurse," wife Sandy!

Mickey Persinger (cousin of Tracy Miller) was put on a ventilator early January for serious breathing issues; he is now under Hospice care and declining. Mickey is just in his 50's.

Tracy Miller had yet another kidney stone and this one blocked her kidney! She had an outpatient procedure on February 7 to remove the stone. She was looking forward to having her stent removed on February 21.

Pastor Bob Young (father of Suzy Crook, and friend of the congregation) was hospitalized at Forsyth Hospital in Winston-Salem on January 25. Stones blocking a bile duct from his gall bladder caused muscle tissue to break down and clog the kidneys with excess protein; that resulted in acute kidney infection which led to renal failure. A procedure was successful in removing several large stones. It is hoped that dialysis will do what the kidneys are supposed to do and give them a rest; then they might start working again. Dialysis arrangements have been set up; and he was able to go home on February 20 with home health care, physical therapy and occupational therapy. *He says*, "It is well with my soul."

Norma Heath (associate First Lutheran member in Council Bluffs, IA) was hospitalized the end of January with numerous health issues. We are happy to report that she is now back home, and learning to navigate dialysis.

Laura Turlington had her three-month scans completed in February, as well as an MRI. She received fairly good results; doctors are checking up on a couple places and she is now taking antibiotics along with new cancer medications.

Raegan Scott (daughter of Wes and Holli Scott, granddaughter of Chip Scott, great-granddaughter of Carolyn Scott) was hospitalized at Brenner Children's Hospital in Winston-Salem from February 9-11. She was experiencing vision problems. One procedure she endured was a spinal tap. Fortunately, removing some of the spinal fluid relieved pressure on her optic nerve; her vision has now improved and she will be put on a prescription medication. Her prognosis is good and she was able to worship with her family on February 18. Raegan wanted her church family to know that "I am the brayest!"

Pearl Grubb (mother of Rick Grubb) was hospitalized mid-February with an infection on her foot; she underwent procedures and antibiotic treatment. The infection could have resulted in possible amputation; but fortunately, it appears that she will recover without that.

Deb Wertman has been undergoing biopsies and specialist consultations. She has been diagnosed with pre-cancer dysplasia and will need more in-depth biopsies; she may also have to begin treatments.

The infant baby of Bobbie and Chris (friends of Sabrina Conrad - they attend Sabrina's mother's church) was born prematurely and weighed only two pounds. This little family lives in Mocksville. The baby is in the neonatal intensive care unit in Wilkes County. Please hold them all in your prayers.

Steve Ketner continues to experience frequent falls; doctors feel it may be residual effects from a stroke he suffered previously.

Pam Mabry underwent an outpatient procedure on February 21.

Logan, special needs son of Shane (Pastor Matt's "comic book guy" in Salisbury), was hospitalized mid-February.

Pat Mills is awaiting a heart catheterization; she will have to have surgery to have her aorta repaired or replaced.

Margie Coggins, friend of FLC (from Dei Gloria Lutheran Church) suffered a massive stroke.

Jon Lough will undergo outpatient surgery at the Lexington hospital on March 4 for hernia repair.

Luke Nebrich (son of Bill and Christy Nebrich, grandson of Teena Walker), a Senior at West Davidson High School, has signed to swim with the University of Missouri. With recent swim events, he has finished his high school swim career as/with:

- -50 free state champion
- -1A/2A 50 free state record holder (20.31)
- -All American 50 free
- -100 butterfly state champion
- -2023/2024 Men's State Championship Most Outstanding Swimmer Award

What a way to end his high school swim career. It was a great day!

The-Dispatch reported Luke's state championship wins in an article that mentioned in addition Luke was named most outstanding male swimmer for the state meet and has now won the second-most titles (three) of any male swimmer in Green Dragon history. "It's obviously a good feeling, but really, I felt like I could have done a little better," said Nebrich, who also claimed a state title in the 100 free a season ago. "During the season, before regionals and states got here, I try to qualify in as many events as I can. I decided to enter the 100 butterfly instead of the 100 free pretty much at the last minute before regionals. I looked at the other times (in the 100 butterfly) and decided why not? And for the 50 free, I was determined to win that this year after finishing second the past two years. Pretty much at the end of the state meet last year, my main goal was to win the 50 free this year." Mission

accomplished. Nebrich actually swam faster in the preliminary round for both events, and his prelim time in the 50 free (20.31) set a new 1-A/2-A record. In the finals of the 50 free, he got a slow start off the block and was the last one in the pool but still made up ground to capture that elusive championship. The 100 butterfly came right after, and Nebrich regrouped quickly to snag another title. Nebrich is known for his 6-foot-5 frame and long, wavy hair, something he began growing during the summer of 2020 during the height of COVID-19. His legacy at West is cemented for his talent, but his legacy among his opponents is with the hair. "I'll probably be remembered as either Tarzan or swimming Jesus," Nebrich said with a smile. "That's what some swimmers from East Davidson started calling me my sophomore year. They were cheering me on, so it was supportive...Along with my parents, I want to thank (West) Coach (Randy) Rouse and the people at Reeds Swim Club, where I started swimming when I was 3 years old, for introducing me to swimming," Nebrich said. "I never thought I would be doing as well as I have been. But I am happy I've had the chance to swim for West and accomplish these things." Well done, Luke; your church family is so very proud of you!


